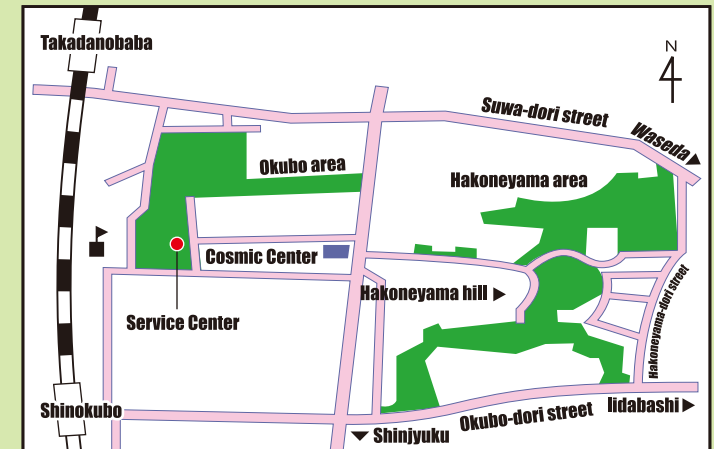

## Hakoneyama hill

In 1668, this area became the property of the Owari clan as their home in Edo. The Toyama-so, a large garden of 449,000 m<sup>2</sup>, was built on the land featuring a pond in the center. Hakone-yama was once called Gyokuempo for its likeness to an upside-down bowl. This man-made hill lies in the center of Toyama-so, surrounded by a series of rolling hills. Hakone-yama is known as the highest hill on the Yamanote train line, at 44.6 meters.

## Monument of Toyama Military Academy

In 1873, the Toyama Branch of Military Academy was founded at Hakoneyama and reorganized as the Toyama Military Academy the following year. Military research and education were conducted here until the end of World War II. In 1967, volunteers related to the Toyama Military Academy founded this monument on a side of the promenade around Hakoneyama.
