The Plant Diversity Center is not just a place to learn about Tokyo's endangered plants; it is an important place that shows plant diversity and allows visitors to learn about the importance of the preservation of vegetation. It is also dedicated to the conservation of endangered plants. To preserve and pass on the environment and valuable plants left in Tokyo to future generations, the Center focuses on "preservation and propagation of plants," "information gathering and delivering information," and "education and dissemination." The Center is divided into an indoor "Information Center," providing various information about native plants in Tokyo, and an outdoor "Educational Botanical Garden" exhibiting Okutama, Musashino, and Izu Islands' vegetation.

In the garden reminiscent of the Musashino region, you can enjoy and feel the beauty of plants and flowers throughout all seasons. The garden was originally a nursery that supplied trees for the streets of Tokyo. After World War II, the garden was opened to the public as Jindai Green Zone, and in 1961, it was given its current name Jindai Botanical Gardens and reopened as Tokyo's only botanical garden. Currently, the garden has about 100,000 plants representing approximately 4,800 species. The garden is divided into 30 blocks by plant species, including the rose, azalea, plum, and bush clover gardens, and you can learn about plants and flowers while enjoying the beautiful scenery. The garden plays a vital role in raising Tokyo residents' interest in greenery by preserving traditional Japanese garden plant varieties and holding events related to the plants and gardening. Since the large greenhouse opened in 1984, rare tropical plants have been collected, allowing visitors to observe vibrant, colorful flowers even in winter.

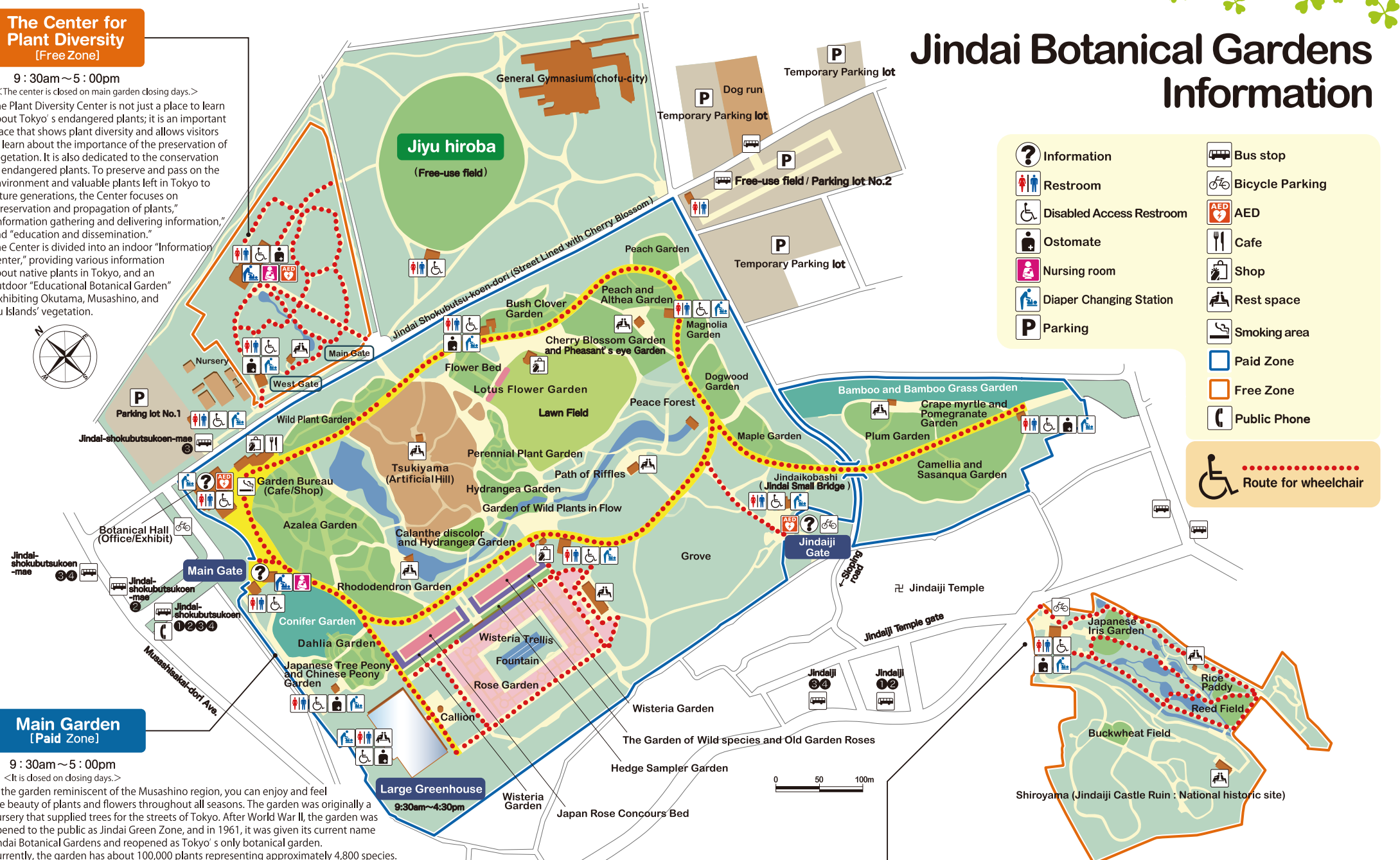
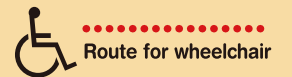

Streams around the Jindai temple flow into the garden and create a marsh. The marsh was used for this Aquatic Botanical Garden. The garden was opened to the public with wooden walking paths for the convenience of visitors. Aquatic flowers and waterside plants such as common reed, Amur silver-grass, Manchurian wild rice, cattail, and golden sweet flag grow in the pond and waterways. Also, Japanese water iris, Japanese iris, bur reed, cow lily, yellow floating heart, Siebold's primrose, purple-loosestrife, Lobelia sessilifolia, and other plants and flowers are planted here.

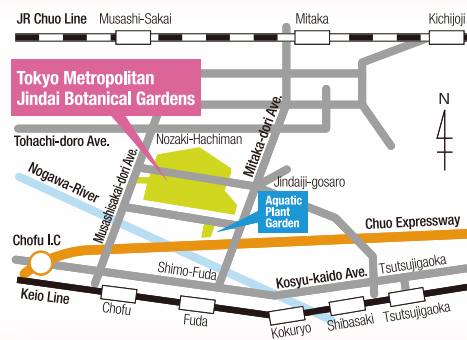
