

Ogamiyama Park is the urban public park which lies in Chichijima of The Ogasawara Archipelago in the midst of the Pacific Ocean, which is located approximately 1,000km south of Tokyo. The park surrounded by the beautiful “Bonin Blue” ocean is divided into two main areas. Ogamiyama Area is hilly area, and Omura Chuo Area is a flat area. You can touch various kinds of nature every area.

★ Ogamiyama Area

From the Observation Platform at the peak of the park which is located behind Futami Prot, you can overlook many places such as Futami Port, Omura, Kiyose, Okumura, Mt. Yagyusan, Susaki, Mt. Yoakeyama, Mt. Asahiya, Mt. Mikazukiya, and Anijima Island. You can watch many endemic plants, when you take a walk along the trails. In recent years, some endemic plants such as Oohamagikyo, Oohamabossu, and the rare Asahi-ebine, have been planted in the park. At night, Bonin Flying Foxes (a natural treasure) come flying to this area to look for their meal.

★ Omura Chuo Area

Omura Beach which is popular with sea-bathers, Festival Square, Ogasawara Visitor Center, Community Square and so on are located in this area. Various events are held all year around at the Festival Square. In particular, the ‘Summer Festival’ is a very popular event for both islanders and tourists. The Omura Beach opens on every New Year’s Day at the earliest timing in Japan. The resting place called ‘Gegege House’ is located in a slightly elevated hill, and is a popular spot of this area.





Main Observation Platform

The entire city area of Chichijima can be seen from the platform.



Panorama Observation Platform

This is one of the best observation platform in Ogamiyama Park. You can see Minamijima and Anijima in the distance and the array of corals right beneath.



Adventure Square

Adventure Square in the Ogamiyama Area. The big slide is very popular with the kids on the island.



The Valley of Himetsubaki

You can take a short stroll through this peaceful area on a wooden boardwalk. Endemic species such as Himetsubaki, Kobugashi, and cosmopolitic species such as Shimamokusei are planted.



Himetsubaki

Island name: Roosuudo
Flower season: Early summer
The flower of Ogasawara Village. You can watch many cute flowers of Himetsubaki in Ogamiyama Area during the flower season.



Takonoki (Screw Pine)

The tree of Ogasawara Village. Because a number of aerial roots look like the tentacles of an octopus, the tree is called Tako-no-ki ("Tako" means an octopus in Japanese).



Community Square

Located close to Futami Port. The Monument of Perry's Arrival and the bell of the former Ogasawara-Maru (cargo-passenger ship) are erected.



Gegege House

The resting place called Gegege House is a popular spot in Omura Area. Usually crowded with many islanders and tourists.



Omura Beach

This is the closest beach to the main street where many islanders and tourists enjoy swimming. The beach opens earliest in Japan.



Festival Square

At the outdoor stage in the middle of the field many events such as the Music Festival, Bon Dancing and New Years countdown are held. You can also enjoy bird watching.



Ogasawara Visitor Center

You can get various kinds of information about the abundant nature, history, and culture of the Ogasawara Archipelago by exhibits, guided walks, and other activity programs.



Children's Play Square

Located in Omura Chuo Area. A lot of families use the playthings every day which were renovated in 2008.

Green Sea Turtle

The turtles return to Ogasawara every summer to lay eggs. You may be able to encounter not only the parents but the new-born babies.
