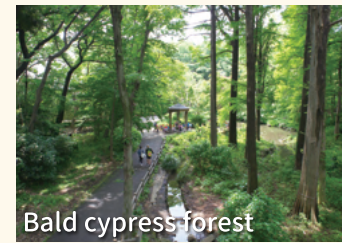

Overview

Tokyo's experimental Mori (Forestry) Park was created on the site of an experimental forestry station established under the former Forestry Agency. It was also built to serve as an evacuation site. The majority of the park's trees were planted during the period of the experimental forestry stations. The park has numerous large trees: varieties include zelkova, camphor, and plane tree, as well as eucalyptus, poplars, and more.

Additionally, there are various types of unusual trees on view in many areas of the park, including varieties from overseas such as the pistacia, red maple, Himalayan pine, as well as many unusual Japanese trees including the cork oak, Japanese beech, poplars, etc.

Day camp ground This facility was established for use by groups of elementary and junior high school students in urban areas, who ordinarily have little access to opportunities for outdoor activities. Note that the area is not intended primarily for use by adults, families, etc. The grounds may be used from May through October, from 9:30 am to 4 pm. Fallen tree nature observation course (Yukari)

A eucalyptus tree planted at Forestry Agency experimental forestry site in 1952 had reached a height of 34 meters and trunk girth of 329 centimeters, but this tree fell as a result of damage incurred by the No. 15 typhoon hitting the East Japan region in September 2011. It caused serious tremors when it fell.

Ordinarily, trees that have fallen as a result of weather conditions, as well as branches and leaves pruned from the trees, are put to good use, for example turned into compost or used for mulching along alongside the park. However, at this park, which is home to numerous trees that are rare both in Japan and other countries, the fallen eucalyptus are left as they are so that visitors can observe how they return to nature. This is part of the new legacy of the park.

- 10 minute walk from Musashi-Koyama Station, Tokyu Meguro Line, Tokyo Metro Mita Line, Tokyo Metro Namboku Line
- Take the Tokyu Bus from Shibuya Station on the JR Yamanote Line (via Ebisu) to Gotanda (Route 72)
1 minute walk from the entrance of Metropolitan Experimental Forestry Park
