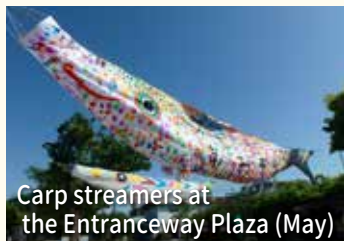
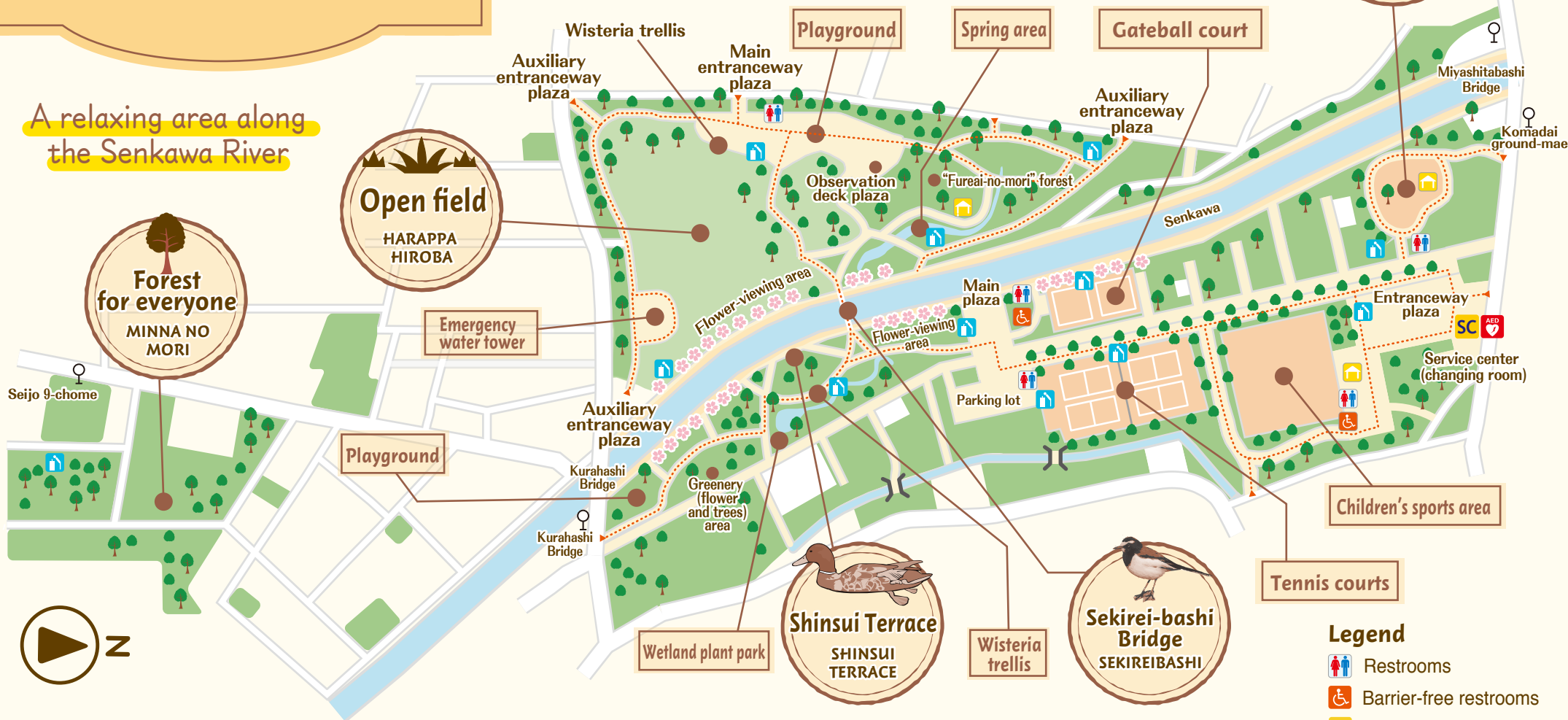

Overview

Soshigaya Park, which occupies a large green stretch amidst a housing development in Setagaya, was opened in June 1975 following refurbishment of the area, with a focus on the site of the Teacher Training College farmland. To this day, parks continue to be refurbished in this manner.

The left bank of the Senkawa River is lined with a children's amusement park, exercise facilities, and more. On the right bank are located fields and greenery. In the spring, the place comes abloom with cherry blooms, Japanese wisteria, dogwood, irises, and more. In the summer, ponds and waterfalls in the park create a cool atmosphere. Small birds including waterbirds, which show themselves occasionally, add to the fun atmosphere of the lush green park, making a wonderful rest area.

Children's okay area

The playground, surrounded by trees, is equipped with a slide, a swing, a sandbox, and more. It is a popular spot for adults to bring their children.

Tennis court

This area features four manmade turf courts. Enjoy the sport in the open air of the natural environment.

Shinsui Terrace

The Hydrophilic Terrace has a staircase where the visitor can climb down the stairs almost to the water surface of the Senkawa River. The place is used as an event hall in the spring and fall.

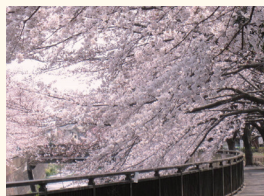
Open field

The Open field, which is situated on a smooth slope, is known to numerous visitors to the park as the site of the old Teacher Training College. The site is also known as a public evacuation area of Setagaya Ward. It is equipped with a water supply station for use in times of disaster.

Cherry blossoms "brought back home"

Cherry blossoms presented to the city of Washington, D.C. by the mayor of Tokyo in 1945 grew steadily over the years along the banks of the Potomac River in the Potomac Park. The area remains a world-class cherry blossom-viewing site. The cherry blossoms along the west side of Senkawa River were grown from seedlings taken from cherry blossoms in the Potomac Park. Therefore, they are known as the cherry blossoms that "came home."

- Take the Odakyu bus bound for Chitosefunabashi at Stop No. 5 at the West Exit of Seijogakuen-mae station on the Odakyu Line and get off at Komadai Grand-mae
- Take the Odakyu bus bound for the West Exit of Seijogakuen-mae Station from the South Exit stop at Chitosekarasuyama Station on the Keio Line and get off at Komadai Grand-mae
