



Toyama Park

Information on the Park

Located in the heart of the metropolis, Toyama Park embraces the two sections of Okubo on the west and Mt. Hakone on the east, separated by the Meiji avenue in the middle.

The Okubo section comprises the Shinjuku Sports Center and abundant greenery giving this park a sports-friendly and tranquil characteristic.

The Mt. Hakone section, on the other hand, encompasses Mt. Hakone in the center surrounded by forest, a flower garden, an adventure park, and a splashing pond for children offering greater diversity.

Mt. Hakone

In 1634, Tokugawa Mitsutomo, the feudal lord of Owari, was granted possession of this land by the Shogun Ietsuna and built Toyamasouteien garden in a Chisen Kaiyu Shiki Teien style where a large pond was set in the center as a focal point with a stroll garden surrounding it so visitors could appreciate its views from all angles. Today, the only remnant of the olden days is an artificial hill that looks like a round ball laid on the ground called Gyokuenpo, surrounded by undulating greenery.

Since the Meiji era (1868-1912), the hill has been colloquially known as Mt. Hakone, and with an elevation of 44.6 meters, it holds the highest point of altitude inside the Yamanote Line.

Monument of the Toyama Military Academy

In 1873, the Toyama Branch of the Military Academy was established at Mt. Hakone. It was reorganized the following year as the Army Toyama School, where military research and education were conducted until the end of the Second World War.

In 1967, a stone monument was erected on the side road of the park at the foot of Mt. Hakone by the people associated with the School.
