

Hand book for Disaster Prevention Parks

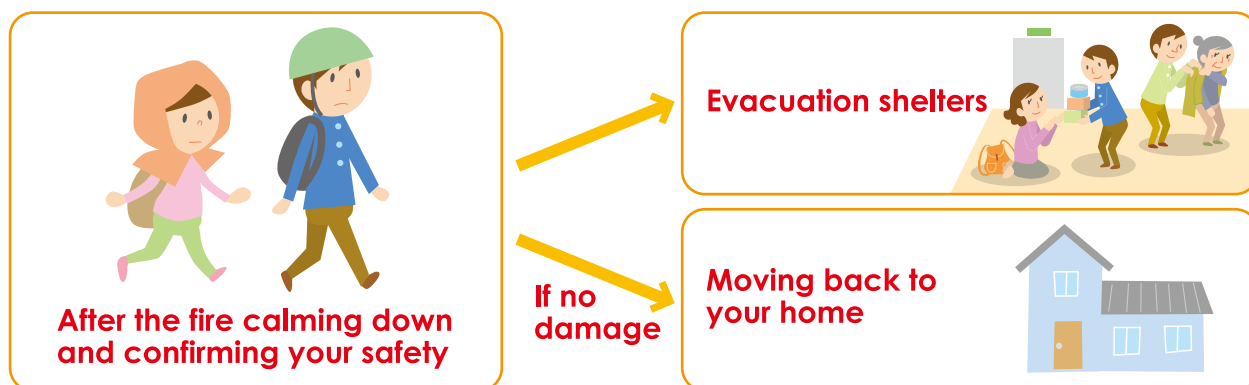
Introduction

What is your purpose of going to the parks? We have various experiences of having fun and relaxing there, playing with children, playing sports, and watching green scenery. Parks have another important function, which is a base for evacuation, rescue and aid in case of a big earthquake. We would like to introduce these functions and facilities, which are set up in the parks, in this handbook. They will become important places if disasters occur. You can plan your actions if a disaster happens in the city.

Mission of the park in case of a big earthquake

Role as evacuation place

Parks can save people's lives in the case of a big fire caused by an earthquake. They can be used as evacuation places. Parks have wide areas and have a lot of trees so people can escape from fire. Also, we advise people to evacuate to parks first when they don't have enough information about the disaster. You should move to designated secure places arranged by local municipal offices after confirming safety in your area.

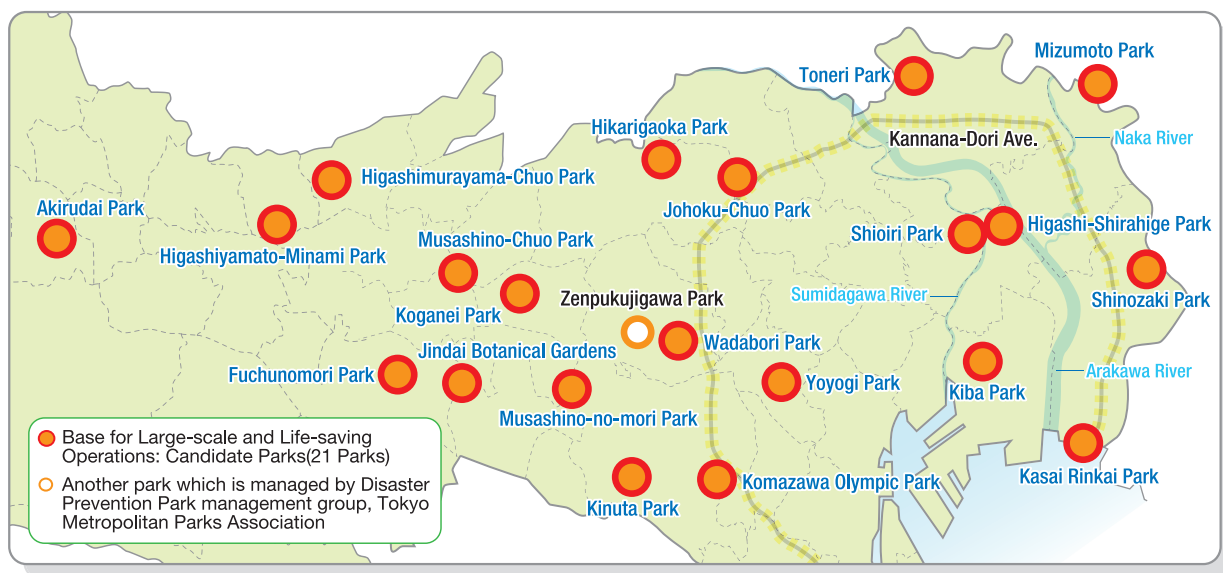


Base for Large-scale and Life-saving Operations

Japan has a large-scale emergency system to gather rescue teams nationwide, such as the Self Defense force, Police Department, and Fire Department, to areas that suffer big damage from earthquakes and other disasters. The Tokyo Metropolitan Government Office has designated some parks as “Candidate location bases for large-scale and lifesaving operations” These can be used for the large-scale emergency system. These parks will be able to be used as provisional heliport bases for rescue teams in case of disaster.

Some areas will be used as heliports in case of disaster.

Disaster Prevention Facilities in the parks

Disaster Prevention Facilities which will work when utilities, electricity, gas and water, are stopped, are equipped in the parks. Please check those facilities in your favorite park.

Disaster Prevention Toilet

This can be used when special tank is put beneath and connected to the sewage pipes.

Covering tent and toilet seat are put above the toilet.

Out of the house

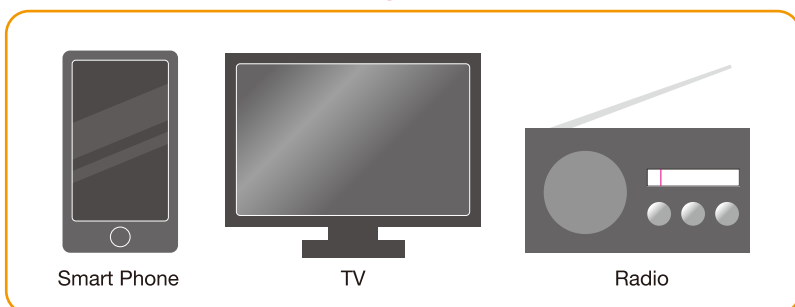


Protect yourself by bag and luggage and not to walk near the window and sign board, wall
